### I. Manufacturing

We are about to see a revival in UK manufacturing; at least that is the verdict of the Chatham branch of Adecco. This would be a welcome development in East Kent where manufacturing has been under the cosh from low cost manufacturing bases in Asia and the Pacific Rim. There is some justification for the optimism from the Office for National Statistics. Its report at the end of September this year stated: "Productivity across the whole economy, measured by output per worker, increased by 1.4 per cent in the second quarter of 2010 compared with the same quarter a year ago. This is up from growth of 1.1 per cent in the previous quarter. The growth reflects an increase in whole economy output." Wage costs declined in the first half of the year: "Manufacturing unit wage costs in the second quarter of 2010 fell by 3.9 per cent compared with the same quarter a year earlier. This was a steeper fall than the 1.1 per cent fall in the previous quarter." This suggests improved margins for manufacturers and a recovery in some key markets overseas.

#### 2. What's The Official View?

Spencer Dale is the Executive Director and Chief Economist at the Bank of England. In his speech prepared for Ist December 2010 to celebrate the 21st Anniversary of our very own Kent Business School in Canterbury, he states:"The growth of exports has underperformed expectations, especially when judged against the acceleration in global demand". Not encouraging, you might think, but he follows this comment with: "The lower level of sterling does appear to have supported goods exports by over 10% over the past year." In other words, perhaps we could have done better but exporters have more reason to smile than most. It is the opinion of the Thanet & East Kent Insider that factories in Greece, Ireland, Portugal and Spain must now envy the floating pound sterling which has given our exporters a distinct advantage when selling into the Eurozone. Greece, Ireland, Portugal and Spain decided to dump their own currencies, a decision that they may regard with less enthusiasm today than was the case a few years ago.

### 3. What Does the Data Say?

Before we jump for joy at a mini recovery, we should note that the scope for improvement is considerable. Although we have data for specific sectors, the government statistics for Manufacturing in the South East date from the end of 2008 and list the percentages of the workforce employed in manufacturing. Top of the list for the South East outside London is Havant with 15.5%. Closer to home in East Kent are: Swale 14.4%, Ashford 10.8%, Dover 10.4%, Medway Towns 9.7%, Tonbridge and Malling 9.7%, Thanet 9.3%, Sevenoaks 8.2%, Tunbridge Wells 6.8%, Shepway 6.7%, Maidstone 5.8% and Canterbury 3.9%. The long term trend away from manufacturing has a long history. In 1978, 6.92 million people were employed in UK manufacturing. This had been reduced to 3.1 million by 2005. # 4. Will We See New Jobs In Manufacturing?

Previous editions of the Thanet & East Kent Insider have noted the increasing importance of Chinese buyers. The rise in UK exports to a growing list of Comfortable Chinese Consumers (CCC may become an acceptable acronym, you read it here first) offers a clear route forward to innovative East Kent companies such as TV One, Freedom Input, AEI Compounds, Zeta Compliance and Cummins. Early pioneers in the market such as

China Gateway International might find that its expertise and long-standing knowledge of the liberated domestic economy in China puts it in a powerful position to advise newcomers on how best to promote their products. Not everyone will agree with Michael Rendell, head of HR services at PwC, who is reported as saying: "The expected headcount increases are encouraging news for the job market and suggest the private sector will be able to accommodate those public sector workers who are made redundant": but if the Medway office of Adecco is correct that: "We might see a longer term development of manufacturing back in the UK over the next few years", companies in East Kent will indeed need the employment agencies to fill the vacancies. ### 6. Half A Million And Counting

Thanet & East Kent Chamber members will recall that as part of the TEKC Go Local campaign, Thanet College earmarked £3.5 million of discretionary spending to be directed henceforth towards companies in Thanet and East Kent. Some of our members have already benefited from this initiative. Following a series of meetings and discussions at Thanet College, we are delighted to confirm that by the end of the college's financial year, we expect £500,000 to have been switched. By the end of October, the purchases from local companies on non-pay related services had risen from 22% to 34% of the budget available. As is to be expected in these initial stages, some sectors show a bigger gain than others; Capital Spend on local companies is now 39% as against a previous 21%; Catering 63%/59%; Marketing 68%/61%; Professional Fees 29%/19%; Repairs and Maintenance 69%/56%. The Thanet & East Kent Chamber will be meeting with the key decision-makers at Thanet College again in the first week of January 2011. We congratulate Thanet College for its excellent relations with local businesses which are set to improve further as the balance of the remaining budget is reviewed.

# 7. Margate In Kentucky

Here is an extract from the press in Kentucky USA on 14th December 2010. "TV One is the proud recipient of the Government Video Salute Award for their CORIOview C2-6104A 4-Window DVI-U Processor. This prestigious award is nominated on by industry professionals and then selected unanimously by the editorial

team of Government Video magazine. The Salute Award is presented in recognition of innovative achievement in the advancement of video technology." There may be a query over what "nominated on" means, but there is no question that TV One of Margate has again triumphed brilliantly in the face of worldwide competition. Regular readers will recall that TV One won the Systems Product of the Year 2010 AV Award for the same product earlier this year. The Thanet & East Kent Insider of  $23^{rd}$  October 2010 reported that: "All Thanet-based manufacturers can take a measure of pride in the achievement which shows that East Kent manufacturing can compete and win in world markets." Since Steven Mattingly joined the top management of TV One Europe in September 2003 from his previous posts as Vine's International Sales Manager and Managing Director at Scancom, TV One has gone from strength to strength. #### 8. News From Dover

Dover Cruise Port has celebrated a successful year welcoming a record 167 cruise calls. First time visits from Disney Magic, Maasdam, AIDA Blu and MV Empress helped boost the number of passengers to over 300,000. Fred Olsen Line and Saga remain key clients. As we have previously reported, the cruise holiday industry remains particularly buoyant, which is just as well if you are travelling by ship. The construction of new cruise liners may have slowed somewhat during the year. We are informed by Cruise Industry News that: "The cruise industry has been on a steady growth course in North America for some 40 years. While the expansion there is expected to continue, albeit at a slower pace, Europe has proven to be the next growth market, and will require another 100 ships to reach the same market penetration level." The same publication tells us that Disney will next month take delivery of the 128,000-ton, 1,250-stateroom Disney Dream. The Disney Fantasy is scheduled to follow in 2012. Tom Wolber, chief operating officer of Disney Cruise Line is quoted as saying: "We're very proud of the fact, that despite these ships being 50 percent larger than the other ships, from a propulsion point of view, we use the same amount of fuel to get the same or slightly better performance than the existing ships." He continues: ""We're always thinking of new guest experiences and how to raise the bar, whether it's onboard or via shore excursions, and the future of guest experiences for the entire fleet. It keeps me busy." We would like him to be kept busy thinking of how Disney customer and the cruise ship passengers of other lines can take their well-endowed wallets and upmarket credit cards to our East Kent retailers.
