### I. Predict and Prevent with EmployAssure

## 2. Skills & Kent

Last week, the Kent Economic Board (KEB) hosted a workshop at the Hilton Hotel, Maidstone entitled "Skills for the Economy: Task Force Employer Workshop". Roger Gabriel, Manager of the Local Skills for Productivity Alliance, and Roger Gough, the cabinet member of Kent County Council responsible for Regeneration and Supporting Independence, gave short presentations. Dr Lee Stoddart, head of strategic planning at Saga Group Ltd, followed with a succinct account of the cultural changes undertaken by the company to address rapid staff turnover and an aversion to training by staff. The workshop sessions provided KEB with feedback from employers. The concerns of Thanet & East Kent Chamber members were voiced direct to KEB. Among the ideas mooted from the floor was that schoolteachers in secondary schools should undertake a short period of work experience, especially if they have never previously been employed in a non-academic post.

### 3. Why is Thanet like Manchester United?

Seven years ago, the South West won the accolade for having the cleanest beaches in the UK. After the BBC published the results of the Blue Flag awards on 5 June 2001, tourists flocked to Torbay and Teignbridge. Fast forward to 5 June 2008 and the BBC reports that Thanet now heads the list. The blue flag awards are independent of government and are administered by Encams on behalf of the Foundation for Environmental Education based in Denmark. Encams has praised ten Thanet beaches unreservedly with a declaration that "the performance was the best anywhere in the country for a decade". Blue flags are awarded to beaches that that have "good access, top notch facilities, are litter free and have clean seawater". Thanet football teams may not appear in football's top division, but, Thanet beaches can now justly claim to be top of the Premier League – just like Manchester United.

### 4. Dave Lee in Dover

Popular local comedian, Dave Lee, will be entertaining dinner guests at the Ramada Hotel, Dover on Friday, 12th September at 7.30pm.
