**Unemployment** has fallen in the last twelve months. Kent has seen a 25.3% reduction in registered universal credit claimants, Canterbury has the lowest youth unemployment in Kent at 3%. Thanet has the highest youth unemployment in South East England at 11.1%.

We now await a prompt and definitive decision from the UK government on the airport's future, as we have been doing for the last 7 years.
