I. Chamber Charity Forum

Registered charities and not for profit organisations are increasingly important parts of our local economy. Given the current pressures on funding, this Chamber will be hosting a Charity Forum on 2 September at 1100 hrs at the Kent Innovation Centre, Broadstairs. 5. Please Be Seated, Your Majesty

Readers of the Thanet & East Kent Insider of 29 July 2008 may recall an item entitled "Building on Quality", which suggested that companies with a genuine commitment to quality might fare better in a downturn than enterprises competing mainly on price. The Chief Executive of Diageo had recently claimed that single malt whisky sales tended to hold up in a recession whereas some of the cheaper brands remained in the bottle longer than in the good times. I visited a quality manufacturer last week, Chamber member Claridge Upholstery. Founded 25 years ago by Steve Claridge, this company makes classic furniture to order at its HQ in Harold Road, Margate. Solid beech frames, mahogany facing and high quality leather ensure that these chairs and chesterfield sofas will remain in fashion for generations. Although all the furniture is handmade, prices are surprisingly reasonable. The British Embassy in Turkey was quite concerned last May when it was due to welcome the Queen, the Duke of Edinburgh and the Turkish Prime Minister. Such a distinguished gathering needed to be seated comfortably. Claridge Upholstery came up with the goods and now has a photograph of the group as proof. 7. Visitors to Kent

The Visit Kent research team has published its data for June 2008. Compared to last year, it shows a 17% increase in visitors to attractions. This is in line with anecdotal evidence that UK day visitors are increasing to some of our coastal resorts and excursion destinations. Germany and France topped the list of overseas visitors. The USA and Australia both registered a

respectable 14%. Occupancy rates of serviced accommodation fell 12% to 42.3% in Thanet with increases experienced only in Canterbury, up 3% to 65.9%, and Swale up 28% to 61.2%. The Kent average is 57.5%, up from 51.1% in 2007. Accommodation providers in rural areas of Kent seem to be faring better than those in towns and on the coast. The sharp rises in fuel coasts may explain much of the downturn in carrier traffic. June figures for the Port of Dover show a year-on-year drop in passengers of 10.1%. The three top concerns of accommodation providers are the UK Economy, the weather and exchange rates. In the current challenging trading conditions, it is perhaps more important than ever to give attention to the service you offer customers. Competing too aggressively on price threatens your margins, compromising on quality threatens your future, but offering more care to your customers is often the cheapest and most direct way to boost your business; the executive below may have other ideas.
