## Your Weekly Business Bulletin from Thanet & East Kent Chamber

### 4<sup>th</sup> December 2008

#### I. More Inward Investment

Microsoft HQ at Reading was just one of the companies attracted to the Chamber business breakfast at Thanet College this morning. There to hear about "Thanet College: New Campus, New Opportunities", the delegates were treated to an overview of the reasons for the planned move of Thanet College to a new purpose-built campus. College Principal, Sue Buss, gave a succinct and persuasive account of the need for the new premises. With a turnover of £15m, she manages a sizeable enterprise that seeks always to marry the best value efficiency of private industry with a demanding public education agenda. As such, the superb facilities promised for the new campus will give Thanet College the opportunity to deliver a wider range of programmes on one site. The new campus will be located in the centre of Thanet almost equidistant from the main population centres of Margate, Cliftonville, Broadstairs and Ramsgate. Relocation Director, Rob Thrower, showed computer generated images of the completed campus and revealed that the buildings will be ready to accept students in September 2011. An important part of the construction phase is the involvement of local companies providing products and services. The main contractor will be obliged to use "locally sourced labour and materials wherever possible". Package tenders will be operative from January 2009. All valid Thanet & East Kent Chamber members are on the list of preferred suppliers dispatched to Wates Construction, the "preferred second bidder". If you wish to make an individual approach, you should email admin@tekc.co.uk with subject line "Supplier to Wates" and we will send you details of the simple procedure required. The build programme will take 82 weeks and cover an area of 20,682 sq m. At peak, 400 operatives will be on site.

## 3. Flybe At KIA

Chamber member, Kent International Airport (KIA), announced yesterday that Europe's largest international airline, Flybe, will be operating scheduled passenger flights to Jersey next summer. Drawing passengers from a wide catchment area covering Kent and much of the Home Counties, Flybe's vote of confidence is a major boost to the area. KIA's Managing Director, Matt Clarke, promises a "hassle-free service" from Manston. Following last week's ceremonial start to the construction of the Turner Contemporary in Margate, Thanet is benefiting from an unprecedented wave of inward investment. The granting of planning permission for Phase One of the China Gateway on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2008 and the forthcoming completion of the first stage of Thanet Earth complement the promise of the London Array and Thanet Off-shore Wind F arm. This Chamber's contention that "It's happening now, it's happening in Thanet" has never looked more apposite.

# 4. Kent Messenger

The government is aware that new challenges require new responses and so is the Kent Messenger Group. Recently completed purpose-built offices in Whitstable show that this multimedia group has confidence in Kent and is prepared to invest its resources in our commercial infrastructure. The images below were taken yesterday while on a tour of the magnificent new buildings which will underpin the KM Group's commitment to Kent. As apart of a new focus on Thanet, one of the senior KM executives, James Coulton, explained that in April 2009, the KM Group will launch a quarterly supplement aimed directly at local businesses in Thanet. The super swish road on the route from Manston to Broadstairs has opened. Traffic is now directed past EuroKent to run alongside G Casino and Vue before it rejoins the main thoroughfare at the exit to Westwood Cross. If you have not updated your SatNav recently, you may find yourselves appearing to be ploughing through a field. Our advice in these situations is to switch off your electronic navigation system and adopt the more traditional approach of looking through the windscreen at where you are going. This radical return to time-honoured practices means you must forego the pleasures of a constantly changing multi-coloured map and the soothing female voice telling you to "Now turn around when possible", but it does have the advantage of avoiding running into other cars and pedestrians.
