I. Planning For Success

Chamber member Dario Bucceri of Manna House Consulting Ltd of Margate informs us that "45% of small and medium enterprises do not have a business plan". Dario claims that you can operate your business more efficiently and more profitably by adopting a strategic business plan which gives you clearly defined competitive advantages. He quotes from the 2008 book, "Strategic Management" where the authors state that "an organisation is unlikely to survive for long, or to become a leader in its field unless there is something distinctive about it". 2. Computer slow?

Some Chamber members have complained recently of slow internet connections. Does it take you ages to download the simplest text? If so, it might be worth your while to check the speed of your connection. This can be done in about 20 seconds by logging onto the website at http://www.broadbandspeedchecker.co.uk and clicking on the Start Speed Test button in the middle of the screen. If your download speed is less than 2000 kbps, you should check that you are using the latest updated version of your browser such as Microsoft Explorer 8 rather than Explorer 7 or 6. At the same website, you can also find guidance on service providers and the latest bargains that might give you a better performance at a lower cost.

3. Holiday Entitlement

Jon Cleverdon of J Cleverdon Chartered Accountants of Broadstairs, tel: 01843 866599, reminds us that the current minimum statutory holiday entitlement of 24 days (4.8 weeks) for a typical full-time worker on a five-day week, has increased. From 1 April 2009, such workers are entitled to a minimum of 28 days (5.6 weeks).

Anyone who has just returned from an expedition to the Antarctic may not have heard the name Susan Boyle, although she is the talk of the town among the Emperor penguins of the Ross Sea. Susan Boyle is of course the singer of "I Dreamed a Dream" who appeared on ITV's Britain's Got Talent last month to enormous public acclaim. Her viewing figures on YouTube outperformed the Rt Hon Gordon Brown's explanation of reforms to MP's expenses by a considerable margin. Perhaps our distinguished Prime Minister should have burst into song. According to the Internet video research firm Visible Measures, Susan Boyle's performance has been viewed more than 220 million times. Media sources close to the singer reveal another and perhaps more disturbing aspect of her success. Piers Morgan, a judge on the show, has spoken of the severe pressure suffered by Susan Boyle and has commented on her preparedness to meet the demands placed upon her. 6. All Change at the Abbey

Our friends at HSBC have informed the chamber of changes at the Abbey. Banco Santander has announced that it is to spend £12 million in a re-branding of its UK operations which will end brands such as Abbey, Bradford & Bingley and Alliance & Leicester. Abbey's credit cards will be the first to be re-banded this year, followed by the 1,000 branches of Abbey and Bradford & Bingley. Alliance &

Leicester is scheduled to receive the make-over treatment by the end of 2010 when the Spanish bank will have over 1,300 Santander-branded branches accessible to any of its UK customers. According to Santander's UK chief executive, Antonio Horta-Osorio, the rebranding will not result in any additional job losses or branch closures in East Kent or anywhere else in the UK.

7. Fast Lane To Boulogne

LD Lines is on schedule to begin in June a new cross-channel ferry service from Dover to Boulogne in its purpose-built new ferry, the Norman Arrow. The vessel is the world's largest diesel-powered catamaran and will be the first lncat 112 metre unit to operate in Europe. The new craft can reach a speed of 40 knots and is designed to provide a temporary home for 417 cars or 567 lane metres of truck space and 195 cars. The accommodation can cater for 1,200 passengers. This magnificent new ship is destined to set a new standard in cross-channel comfort. Prices start at £27.50 each way for a car and 4 passengers. For details, telephone 0844 576 8837.
