I. New Business

There are still opportunities to win contracts of up to £100,000 to supply the London 2012 Olympics. Small and Medium Enterprises are invited to register on the government's website at www.supply2.gov.uk. The first piece of good news is that registration is now free, see https://www.competefor.com/business/login.jsp. Previously businesses could be charged as much as £180 to participate in the scheme. Make sure you have with you a description and profile of your business with the information you would like a potential buyer to see. The second bonus is that if you are quick off the mark, you can attend a workshop in Thanet when all will be explained. Assuming you are not located close to Slough, Reigate, Milton Keynes, Worthing or Emsworth, your nearest venue is likely to be Eurokent Business Park, Ramsgate. 2. I Want A Bigger House

Research just published by the Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment (CABE) tells us that just over a third of the 2,500 householders interviewed claimed that they did not have enough room in their kitchen for basic appliances such as a toaster and a microwave. Have new houses been getting smaller over the last twenty-five years? The sample group living in and around London in houses built since 2003 certainly thinks so. CABE points the finger at developers and local authorities. In answer to the claim from house builders that there are not the buyers for larger homes, CABE states, "By building the smallest homes in Europe, they're not giving people the choice. Homebuyers deserve well designed homes that allow them to choose how they live." One recommendation is to follow the standard practice in many overseas countries such as Japan where Estate Agents routinely provide floor plans and quote the total floor area rather than simply the number of bedrooms. It cannot be easy for a local authority to decide whether to allow the development of 100 medium to large houses, 150 smaller units or 250 apartments to be used for social housing. Many Chamber members are active in the residential and commercial property markets. We welcome their contribution to the debate.

3. How Are We Doing?

The Kent and Medway unemployment figures have arrived this week from the ever excellent KCC Analysis and Information team. The figures for July 2009 can be compared with the same month in 2008. Thanet and Shepway show the lowest increases since last year with both districts registering under 70%. This compares well with the Kent average of a 95.6% annual growth in adults of working age seeking Jobseekers Allowance and National Insurance Credits. Nevertheless, Thanet remains the district with the most claimants, just under 4,000. There is a measure of encouragement from the knowledge that this has not increased since last month. Notably, one of the most deprived wards, Cliftonville West, has registered a drop in unemployment of 1.7% since June 2009. The ward with the biggest unit increase in the jobless figures is Luton & Wayfield in Medway which now has 342 more unemployed than at the same time last year.

The strategy examines six themes, Education, Economy, Communities, Transport, Visitor Destination and Environment. 6. Support Your Airport

Airports are a hot topic for the East Kent business community as Kent International Airport at Manston and London Ashford Airport at Lydd are potential key drivers for economic regeneration. We know from the authoritative study, "The social and economic impact of airports in Europe" by York Aviation (2004) that "Given that there are 950 onsite jobs created per million passengers ... we conclude that for every million passengers (workload units), European airports support around 2,950 jobs nationally, 2,000 jobs regionally, or 1,425 jobs sub regionally." As the Thanet unemployment rate is currently more than 50% above the rate for Kent and the South East, the last thing the area needs is a disincentive to investment in airport infrastructure. Sadly, that is just what we have in the Rating (Empty Properties) Act 2007 and the government's plan to increase tax on international air travel. Air Passenger Duty (APD) is scheduled to rocket in November of this year and a further sharp rise is due be introduced in 2010. A family of four flying to Australia will shortly have to pay £340 in APD alone; more than double the current rate of £40 per passenger. Not many people will have doubled their income in the last year. The travel industry views the tax hike as threatening to tourism and passenger air routes as well as decreasing competition and threatening jobs.
