4. Yet More About Pensions

We continue our campaign to raise awareness about the impending changes to pension arrangements. As an active and usually vociferous member of the government's advisory group, this Chamber takes a special interest in the costs and obligations to be imposed on Small & Medium Enterprises. Cllr Clive Hart has kindly drawn our attention to a recent report by the Department of Work & Pensions on the likely responses by SMEs to the 2012 pension reforms. Anyone with a professional interest in pensions will find this report most useful, as will anyone else who has difficulty getting to sleep at night, as the following extract shows. "In discussing the contribution rates that employers would make, all of the non-providers, non contributors and those contributing less than the 3% indicated that they would contribute no more than the minimum 3%. Employers that were already offering pensions with more than a 3% contribution – and typically had a high take-up – thought that they would expand their existing scheme to the rest of the workforce on the same contributions basis." 5. Training

In its most recent Quarterly Economic Bulletin of earlier this month, the ever excellent Research & Intelligence department of Kent County Council summed up the current training climate neatly as "Business continues to value training – but support is required to maintain investment" and "to ensure firms continue to invest in apprenticeships, financial support is a priority". The same bulletin states later, "The gloomy picture painted by today's survey is one of not only fewer jobs but also of stagnant salary levels and much increased competition". This Chamber is currently in negotiations with public funding bodies to bring much needed support to companies in the East Kent coastal business community. 6. News From Dover

The latest financial report from the Port of Dover shows a record £60.8m in revenues with ferries contributing £44.3 million, up 3.7%. Cruise ship visits increased from 132 to 144 with receipts up 28.9% and a record 274,000 passengers. Similar rises are projected for the current financial year. We know from a report by Arup in 2006 that the Port of Dover contributes £557 million to the economy of which 91% is estimated to fall within Kent. With our friends at the Dover District Chamber of Commerce, this Chamber will be working closely with Dover Harbour Board to maximize the opportunities for companies in the East Kent coastal business community to benefit from their close proximity to one of the busiest drive-on, drive-off ferry terminals in the world. This

Chamber supports the £400 million development plan for Dover Terminal 2 and looks forward to the day when improvements to the road and parking infrastructure will replace the wholly inadequate measures currently in force when Operation Stack is implemented. The severe congestion that results from queues of heavy goods vehicles on our major trunk roads restricts access to East Kent businesses and prevents or delays deliveries of supplies to our shops, offices and factories.

7. Industrial Professors

A meeting last week of the Industrial Professors board of Thanet College looked at the many training opportunities available at the College. This board represents a powerful lobbying group and includes leaders from Thorley Taverns and Summit Aviation as well as distinguished representatives from the public sector. Although Thanet College is known to many for its expertise in catering and hairdressing, there are many more students studying engineering and business-led programmes. 8. Academy FM

Kent newest radio station, Academy FM, is now set to start broadcasting in early 2010. Ofcom has awarded the station a frequency which is now awaiting clearance from France. East Kent's magnificent benefactor, Roger De Haan, has agreed to supply most of the technical equipment and pre-launch expenditure with the result that the station is now close to finalising its budget in preparation for the launch. Some Kent County Council councillors have kindly agreed to allocate some of their remaining funding allocation to this community project. With a remit to involve school children throughout Thanet and not just at the Marlowe Academy where the studio is based, Academy FM promises to make a major contribution to training young people in the creative industries sector as well as providing a significant new focus on Thanet. Operations Director, David Atkey, is used to handling pressure situations, as anyone on the BBC staff will testify. You don't get to be a producer of Bob Geldoff's Live Aid without having considerable diplomatic skills to add your technical prowess. This Chamber wishes David and his station manager, Pete Willson, every success in raising the final amount of money to meet its budget target.

9. Pfizer

As residents and businesses in Sandwich know, Pfizer's manufacturing plant at the East Site ceased in June of this year. The first fermentation units used to manufacture Terramycin, an antibiotic, were installed fifty-five years ago and celebrated at the time by a visit from Sir Alexander Fleming, the Nobel Prize winning scientist who discovered penicillin. Since then, Pfizer has made a remarkable contribution to East Kent life and we celebrate the community-minded spirit of its managers and shareholders. In 2008, Pfizer donated more than £1.3 million to community groups with 600 employees volunteering their time to work on community projects. Every day 2.7 million Britons take medicines provided by Pfizer and the company remains fully committed to its research programmes. Currently under investigation are new treatments for Alzheimer disease, rheumatoid arthritis, ulcerative colitis, dry eye disease and transplant rejection. In a letter to this Chamber, the Pfizer Community Affairs Manager, Kevin Charles, notes that the company will "continue to help find new cures for unmet medical need."

II. SatNav Problems

One baffled member of the public has contacted the Chamber asking for advice about his new Satellite Navigation System. Although this was fresh out of its box, when he drove along New Haine Road on the western approach to Westwood Cross Shopping Centre in Thanet last Wednesday, a strident female voice told him "Make a u turn now, make a u turn now". The Thanet & East Kent Insider reported on this phenomenon in its edition of 4 December 2008. It appears that the New Haine Road is still classified as a ploughed field in the software supplied to at least one of the top three SatNav companies in Europe. Our advice now is the same as it was nearly a year ago and bears repetition. Adopt the traditional approach of looking through the windscreen at where you are going. This radical return to a time-honoured practice will mean that you must forego the pleasure of a constantly changing multi-coloured map but it does have the advantage of avoiding running in to other cars and pedestrians.
